## Romans 8:37-39 (NLT)

# Jonah 3:9-10 (NLT)

<sup>9</sup> Who can tell? Perhaps even yet God will change his mind and hold back his fierce anger from destroying us." (Parallel with the captain of the ship) <sup>10</sup> When God saw what they had done and how they had put a stop to their evil ways, he changed his mind and did not carry out the destruction he had threatened.

# Jonah 4:1-3 (NLT)

<sup>1</sup> This change of plans greatly upset Jonah, and he became very angry. <sup>2</sup> So complained to the Lord about it: "Didn't I say before I left home that you would do this, Lord? That is why I ran away to Tarshish! I knew that you are a merciful and compassionate God, slow to get angry and filled with unfailing love. You are eager to turn back from destroying people. <sup>3</sup> Just kill me now, Lord! I'd rather be dead than alive if what I predicted will not happen."
